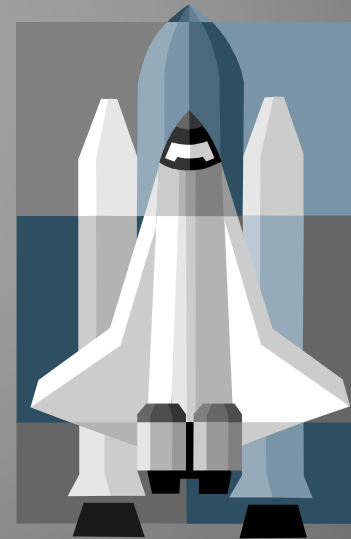

Importance of End Year Results

- Determine entry into next year (A – D grades to do A2 level)

- Determine range of choice of university (for 2016) & for company sponsored career programmes.
